CHARLES TREGER

Internationally acclaimed as a violin virtuoso, Charles Treger recently celebrated his 25th anniversary season with three highly successful performances at Carnegie Hall. The first American to win first prize in the International Wieniawski Competition in Warsaw, he has since made five repeat tours of Poland and has established the "Charles Treger Award" for the best Polish violinist in each succeeding Wieniawski Competition.

One of the most active performers on the concert scene today, Mr. Treger regularly performs his repertoire of more than 50 concerti with leading orchestras and renowned conductors. His reputation as a top chamber music performer also has been firmly established. A founding member of the famed Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, he continues his activities as a member of the Bach Aria Group. To commemorate the 150th anniversary of the death of Franz Schubert, he collaborated in 1978 with André Watts in a series of concerts entitled "A Celebration of Schubert," which included that composer's complete works for violin and piano.

In 1973 Lawrence University awarded Mr. Treger an honorary doctor of fine arts degree. He was visiting professor of music at Lawrence from 1974 to 1981, and, during that time, he performed on many occasions with the Lawrence University Symphony Orchestra and with members of the Conservatory of Music faculty and conducted master classes. He has also held teaching positions at the University of Iowa, the New England Conservatory of Music, and the Hartt School of Music. His concert instrument is the beautiful "Hartmann" Stradivarius, which was made in 1723.
